Parks & Recreation

he Parks and Recreation Department is working hard preparing for the spring and summer. The Parks Master Planning process is currently underway. Surveys have been sent to a random population to seek a statistically valid opinion from the residents; specific user group meetings have been held to gather needs and wants of current users, and the second public meeting was conducted at the January 14 City Council meeting. The next step in the process will be to formulate initial park recommendations. There will still be opportunities for the public to provide input throughout the remainder of the project. Police Department

ACCELERATED ENTRY RECRUITMENT

ecruitment and selection of the next generation of police officers is one of the biggest challenges facing law enforcement organizations and their leaders today. The Collinsville Police Department is not immune to these challenges. For the past several years, we have seen applicant interest continue to drop. Fewer and fewer people are applying or testing for police jobs across the county, while at the same time, seeing an increase in the number of veteran officers, hired in the 1990's as part of federal Communitv Policina grants, reaching retirement. This presents a significant problem. More job vacancies with fewer qualified, quality applicants to fill those vacancies. While this is a big challenge, the leadership team at the Collinsville Police Department is up to that challenge. We are committed to hiring the best possible candidates to fill our vacancies, without lowering standards, while continuing to provide the same professional police ser-

vice that our citizens have come to expect. As a result, the Collinsville Police Department is dramatically increasing its recruitment efforts.

ypically, when we hire a new police officer without experience, they must first attend the state-mandated 14 week police academy at Southwestern Illinois College. Upon graduation, the Probationary Officer will enter our 14 week Field Training Program where they will take what they learn from the Police Academy, build upon it, and learn "the Collinsville way." Essentially, from hire date to solo patrol, it will take 7 months to train an inexperienced police officer.

or the first time in our history, the Collinsville Police Department has initiated an Accelerated Entry Recruitment and Testing Process that will help supplement our traditional Entry-Level Testing Process that we conduct each year. What this means

NEW FACES

On December 16th, 2019, Officer Adam Padilla and Hannah Chapman were sworn in by Mayor John Miller as the two newest police officers for the City of Collinsville. Officer Padilla and Officer Chapman replace the recently retired Dan Porter and Ray Rowland.

Adam Padilla, 28, of Edwardsville, was employed as a part-time Civilian Police Aide with the Collinsville Police Department for three years prior to his hire as a police officer. Adam is the first "home-grown" Civilian Police Aide to be hired by the department. Adam earned his Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from Southern Illinois University in 2017.

Hannah Chapman, 22, of Edwardsville, was employed by Woodland Elementary School in Edwardsville



as a teacher's aide in the Special Education Department prior to her joining our team at the Collins-ville Police Department. Additionally, in her spare time, Hannah was a goalkeeper coach with the Glen-Ed Soccer Club. Hannah also conducted an internship with the Illinois State Police in July 2019 prior to her graduation from Southern Illinois University with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice.

is that we are directly targeting and recruiting experienced police officers to help us fill vacancies that are being created through mass retirements. By doing so, we are bringing in valuable experience from outside agencies. However, the biggest advantage to this process is that the recruit does not have to attend the police academy, thus trimming that 7 month time frame from hire date to solo patrol in half. When faced with a large number of retirements at one time like we did in the Summer/Fall of 2019, this recruitment option will be invaluable.

Next, Officer Padilla and Officer Chapman will spend the next 14 weeks attending the Police Academy at Southwestern Illinois College. They will then transition into our Field Training Program where the knowledge, skills, and abilities they learned at the academy will be put to the test.

ecently, you may have noticed a fire truck responding with an ambulance to medical emergencies throughout the City. You may have asked yourself, why is a fire truck going to a medical emergency? The answer is simple; this change in emergency response is designed to provide our residents, visitors and guests with added emergency care personnel at each emergency.

art of the reason we've begun sending a fire truck with the ambulance is increased staffing. In 2018, the City and the Firefighters Union partnered to increase daily staffing at both stations. The Firefighters increased their workweek by 4.15 hours, and the City increased minimum staffing from 6 personnel per day to 8 per day. This allows us to better respond to the increasing number of emergency calls coming in at the same time. We have more people on duty to respond to critical emergency medical calls with both an ambulance and fire truck, manned by four firefighter/paramedics. Once the medical emergency is under control, the fire engine can still respond to other emergency calls directly from the scene.

Il members of the Collinsville Fire Department are trained and certified as Paramedics, and responding fire trucks are equipped with major advanced life support equipment like emergency medications and heart monitors, allowing first responders to provide better care to our residents, faster and more efficiently. When an ambulance may not be immediately available, personnel on the fire truck can begin advanced treatment for a heart attack, stroke, diabetic issue, or any other medical emergency.

hese increased resources are a great benefit for our community, and help support our primary mission of delivering exceptional customer service to our residents, visitors, and guests by providing them incomparable emergency services.



KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT DATES

ALL SPOTS AT EACH SCHOOL WILL BE ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS

The enrollment schedule is for:

1. Children entering kindergarten next year who are not currently in Pre-K or Early Childhood. CUSD10 resident children currently enrolled in Collinsville Pre-K or Early Childhood programs do not need to re-enroll in the District for Kindergarten unless there has been a change of address. NOTE: Children must be five years old on or before September 1, 2020.

2. Those children entering first grade who are not presently attending Kindergarten Classes in the public schools.

TO ENROLL YOUR CHILD. YOU WILL NEED TO BRING WITH YOU... 1. Certified Birth Certificate. The certificate issued by the hospital is NOT acceptable according to Illinois State Law.

2. Proof of Residency within the

On the first day of school, your child must present a completed physical examination form with all immunizations listed as required by Collinsville Unit 10. Your child will also be required to have a dental and an eye exam.

HCI Alternatives

(1014 Eastport Plaza Drive) Medical and recreational cannabis dispensary

On the 1st of the year, HCI Alternatives began selling recreational cannabis at 1014 Eastport Plaza Drive in accordance with the Illinois Adult Use Cannabis Act . The establishment netted approximately 2.5 million dollars of sales over 10 days. This accounts for 23% of the total 11 million dollars' worth of sales statewide. The City receives 2.25% sales tax on all transactions, and the rate will increase to 5.25% starting July 1, 2020. The City plans on investing those dollars into capital improvement projects that will benefit the City's infrastructure. Additionally, staff is working with HCI Alternatives to address parking along the roadways in Eastport Plaza, as a result of the tremendous demand, by securing additional parking at Gateway Fun Park. It is expected that the demand will eventually ease and normal operations will return with the facilities existing parking being able to serve its customers.

Great Streets

In December 2017, the City of Collinsville was awarded a \$75,000.00 planning grant through the Great Streets Initiative sponsored by East-West Gateway Council of v Governments to develop the St. Louis Road - Collinsville Road Great Streets Initiative Plan. The City embarked on this project to revitalize a vital economic corridor by inducing private investment and increasing and enhancing opportunities for pedestrian activity through a unique, inviting, vibrant place and connection for residents, workers, and visitors traveling to, through, and within the corridor. The corridor begins at the intersection of St. Louis Road and Main Street, near Uptown, and extends west along St. Louis Road and Collinsville Road ending at Cahokia Mounds World Heritage Site.



The St. Louis Road - Collinsville Road Great Streets Initiative Plan is a community-driven plan informed by robust community and stakeholder engagement. The Plan establishes consensus on the community's vision and priorities for revitalizing the corridor. The consultant team utilized a multidisciplinary planning approach examining the Corridor's existing conditions, issues, and opportunities through the lenses of Urban Design, Market Analysis and Strategy, Transportation Planning, and Environmental Infrastructure Planning.

The scope of this Great Streets project includes a comprehensive corridor planning approach assessing existing conditions, identifying opportunities, and the developing a plan for future implementa-

The St. Louis Road and Collinsville Road Great Streets Initiative Plan was Adopted by the Collinsville City Council on November 12, 2019.

Two local landmarks, McDill's Irish Pub (334 St. Louis Road) and Kruta Bakery (300 St. Louis Road), are leading the way in implementing the goals of this plan through redevelopment projects which include new construction, vibrant outdoor spaces, and pedestrian-oriented amenities.
