OVERVIEW

- National Community Survey (NCS) is a tool to measure residents' experience living in Collinsville
- NCS Compares collected data to Collinsville's own historical data and national data
- Collinsville has previously participated in the NCS in 2007, 2009, 2011, and 2019
- The NCS collects information on residents':
 - Overall Confidence in Collinsville's Governance
 - Overall Quality of Life
 - 10 "Facets of Livability"
- 2023 Collinsville NCS:
 - Ran from March 27 May 8, 2023
 - Received 366 responses
 - Results were weighted to reflect our population






- 43% Rated as Excellent or Good

Confidence in Collinsville Governance, 2023






COLLINSVILLE

- Similar to National Benchmark


Quality of Life Comparison

FACETS OF LIVABILITY:

- Livability is broken into 10 unique facets
- Collinsville residents ranked the importance of these facets in the following order:
 - 1. Safety
 - 2. Economic Health
 - 3. Utility Infrastructure
 - 4. Natural Environment
 - 5. Parks & Recreation
 - 6. Education, Arts, & Culture
 - 7. Health & Wellness
 - 8. Connection & Engagement
 - 9. Transportation/Mobility
 - 10. City/Community Design



FACETS OF LIVABILITY: SAFETY




- 59% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Decreased from 2019
- Lower than National Benchmark


Highlights:

- Most all numbers held constant from 2019 2023 except for "Police/Sheriff services"
 - This rating dropped from 89% to 66%
 - This rating is similar to Benchmarks

Feeling of Safety Comparison












- 47% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Increased from 2019
- Similar to National Benchmark


Economic Health Comparison



Highlights:

- "Collinsville as a place to work," "Collinsville as a place to visit," and "Employment Opportunities" rated *lower* than Benchmark
- "Collinsville as a place to visit" increased 6 points
- Only 15% of residents believe the impact of the economy will be Very Positive or Somewhat Positive

Economic Health, 2023






FACETS OF LIVABILITY: UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE QUALITY

- 59% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Similar to National Benchmark


Highlights:

Utility Infrastructure Quality, 2023






FACETS OF LIVABILITY: NATURAL ENVIRONMENT QUALITY


- 54% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Decreased from 2019
- Lower than National Benchmark

Highlights:

- "Cleanliness," "Yard waste pickup," and "Open space" rated lower than Benchmark
- "Water resources" rated much lower than Benchmark



Natural Environment Quality, 2023






FACETS OF LIVABILITY: PARKS & RECREATION

- 61% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Lower than National Benchmark

Parks & Recreation Opportunities Comparison




Highlights:

- All questions within this facet rated lower than Benchmark
- "City parks," "Recreation programs/classes," and "Recreation centers/facilities" improved 8 points or more since 2019

FACETS OF LIVABILITY: EDUCATION, ARTS, & CULTURE


- 33% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Decreased from 2019
- Lower than National Benchmark

Education, Arts, & Culture Opportunities Comparison 90% 80% 70% 60% 50% 40% 30% 20% 10% 0% 2019 2023

Highlights:

- "Opportunities to attend cultural/arts/music activities," "Community support for arts," "K-12 education," and "Adult education" all rated *lower* than benchmark
- "Opportunities to attend cultural/arts/music activities" increased 8 points since 2019
- "Availability of affordable, quality childcare" decreased
 17 points since 2019

Education, Arts, & Culture Opportunities, 2023









- 51% Rated as Excellent or Good

Health & Wellness Opportunities, 2023






FACETS OF LIVABILITY: CONNECTION & ENGAGEMENT

- Similar to National Benchmark


Highlights:

Residents' Connection & Engagement, 2023






FACETS OF LIVABILITY: TRANSPORTATION/MOBILITY

- Similar to National Benchmark

Transportation System Quality




Highlights:

Transportation Systems Quality, 2023








FACETS OF LIVABILITY: CITY DESIGN/LAYOUT


- 55% Rated as Excellent or Good
- Decreased from 2019
- Similar to National Benchmark

Highlights:

 "Your neighborhood as a place to live," "Well-designed neighborhoods," and "Overall appearance" rated lower than Benchmark









KEY FINDINGS & RELATIONSHIP TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Key Findings:

- Safety continues to be the highest priority for residents
- Economic outlook is worrisome for Collinsville residents
- Parks & Recreation has had substantial improvements in ratings in several areas; Parks & Recreation remains very important to residents

Strategic Plan:

- The key findings of the NCS highlight many areas of need that the City has committed to improving through the adoption of the 2022-24 Strategic Plan.
- The following 2022-24 Strategic Plan Goals are identified as highest priority based on the NCS Facets of Livability survey questions:
 - Goal 3: Encourage tourism and economic development
 - Goal 4: Invest in public infrastructure
 - Goal 5: Provide quality parks and parks facilities
 - Goal 6: Keep Collinsville safe
