COLLINSVILLE RECEIVES 2023 ILLINOIS WORKFORCE PARTNERSHIP BUSINESS LEADERSHIP AWARD

The City of Collinsville was selected as the 2023 Illinois Workforce Partnership recipient for the Business Leadership Award. This award was attributed to our partnership with Madison County Employment & Training Department, Collinsville Community Unit School District #10, and U.S. Department of Labor. Our Apprenticeship Program is a first of its kind program where the City employs High School Students with

disabilities to work in our departments. After the yearlong program, the student receives their Apprenticeship Certificate and has the opportunity to be a permanent employee of the City.

BELTLINE ROAD - IDOT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Beltline Road, a vital arterial roadway that connects Illinois State Route 157 and 159, falls under the jurisdiction and maintenance of the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). Although the City lacks direct control over IDOT's maintenance schedule, we have maintained an active dialogue with IDOT regarding essential ADA enhancements and the resurfacing of Beltline Road. IDOT has earmarked Beltline Road resurfacing as one of their upcoming projects, scheduled for implementation between the Spring and Summer of 2024. Currently, IDOT is in the final stages of securing the necessary right-of-way acquisitions. The City is eagerly awaiting the formal project bid letting, which is anticipated to be set for either January or March of 2024. Once the bidding process is complete, the

PARTNERING TOGETHER

The City of Collinsville is partnering with the Collinsville Township to provide a free, one-time, limb and yard waste collection for residents. There is no need to call to register in advance. Republic Services will pick up any limbs and yard waste that is put out at residences on your **NORMAL TRASH DAY THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 13**TH - **17**TH.



WHEN

November 13TH through November 17TH. Pickup will occur on your normal trash day.



WHAT

Grass, leaves, flowers, stalks, stems, small tree trimmings and branches. All leaves and yard waste must be in a can or paper bag the weight of which shall not exceed 50 pounds. No plastic bags.



TREE LIMBS

Small tree trimmings and branches (less than 4 feet in length and less than 3 inches in diameter) shall be in a can or paper bag the weight of which shall not exceed 35 pounds. Tree trimmings may also be tied into bundles and laid in piles curbside.

COLLINSVILLE TOWNSHIP has a multitude of programs that assist low income households, seniors, and households with disabled members. The following is a summary of programs that provide assistance to residents living in Collinsville Township. If you feel any of these programs can benefit you or your family please call to make an appointment with our office. We will do everything possible to assist you.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE:

This is a program of last resort which the Township provides to its residents in special emergency situations. This means an applicant has to apply for all other public benefits available first. The broad general qualification to participate in this program is that the applicant must live within the Collinsville Township (City of Collinsville within Madison County). There are income level restrictions and other qualifications involved in participating in this program. All of the information and application forms are available through your Collinsville Township Office at 307 E Main St. Collinsville, Illinois.

LIHEAP:

This is a program designed to assist our Township residents (City of Collinsville within Madison County) who qualify for low income home energy assistance. The purpose of the program is to ensure that needy families, elderly, disabled and qualifying individuals have access to basic utilities necessary for their household to function and in particular to provide comfort and protection from extreme heat, extreme cold and inclement weather conditions. Call to make an appointment 618-344-1290.

BENEFIT ACCESS PROGRAM:

This is a program to provide certain benefits to seniors and persons with disability. The benefits available through this program include a license plate fee discount for qualifying individuals and also free rides on fixed-route transit systems. For further information, the fixed-route transit schedule times are available through MCT. Eligibility to participate in this program is determined by income, resident age and/or disability.

If you have any questions or want to apply for any of these programs please call 618-344-1290 to find out if you qualify and what steps you will need to take to get assistance.

Collinsville Township also manages and coordinates activities at the Collinsville Senior Center located at 420 E. Main St, Collinsville.

The Collinsville Senior Center provides a variety of benefits and a myriad of programs for the benefit of Township residents. Among those programs offered at the Collinsville Senior Center are nutritious balanced hot homemade meals, offered Monday through Friday from 11am to 12:30pm. The Collinsville Senior Center has many ever-changing weekly activities. There's always something new! Some of our ongoing activities at the Center include Yoga, Exercise classes, Bingo, Dominoes, Bridge, Pinochle, Shuffleboard, Pool, Arts and Crafts and many, many more. Our Collinsville Senior Center provides a



warm welcoming environment for socializing, networking, meeting old friends and making new friends. The Collinsville Senior Center has coordinated the "Folks wagon". The purpose of the Folks wagon is to get all of the Collinsville Senior Center regulars, newcomers and visitors out and about. Some of the destinations of the Folks wagon are preplanned field trips to new and different places! There's always a new destination for the Folks wagon! We often choose the designations based on popular request. Some of the standard trips have included Busch Stadium, the Arch, Meramec Caverns, Springfield IL and the Zoo. The Collinsville Senior Center offers easy to understand technology classes offering simple to understand concise educational programs teaching how to use your laptop, Ipad and even programming cell phones. The Center also provides rules of the road review programs to assist in renewing your Illinois driving privileges and even free tax preparation services annually. The Collinsville Senior Center also sponsors and is a designated center for receiving preventive vaccinations as a public service. . . and even more.

ASSESSORS DEPARTMENT:

The Collinsville Township assessor is charged with fairly and accurately assessing all real property located in Collinsville Township both within and outside of the City of Collinsville Corporate limits. Depending upon age, disabilities, whether or not your home is owner-occupied, or even if you are a Veteran, certain exemptions may apply to your real estate assessment. In addition, you may be eligible for property tax freezes and our Township Assessor's Office is ready, willing, and able to assist you with any questions you may have in that regard. If you have any questions, please contact 618-345-0051. The assessor's Office is open from 8:30am-4:30pm at 307 E Main, Collinsville.

ROAD AND BRIDGE DEPARTMENT:

Where the City road maintenance crew's responsibility ends at the City limits, Collinsville Township Road and Bridge Dept. maintenance begins. Did you ever wonder how the picturesque rural byways stay so well-maintained and clear of snow and other impediments? They plow and salt the roads to keep them safe so our vehicles don't slide off the roadway and cause serious injury to ourselves or others.

Collinsville Township is responsible for road projects and maintenance throughout Collinsville Township outside the City limits of Collinsville and Maryville within Madison County. But that's not all the Collinsville Township Road and Bridge Dept does. It manages drainage and flood control throughout the district. It makes sure that the creeks and streams run free and clear so that they don't backup onto the adjoining landowner's properties.

In addition, Collinsville Township has yard waste dumpsters available for City of Collinsville residents. It is Collinsville Township's belief that all Township residents, whether they live in the City of Collinsville Corporate limits or the unincorporated outlying areas of the Township, should have equal access to the amenities which the Township has to offer for all of its residents and the City is certainly part of the Township. Dumpster access is available during normal office hours (7:00am-3:00pm) at 1407 N Bluff Road.

REMEMBER: Collinsville Township holds its regular monthly meeting on the second Tuesday of each month at the Collinsville Senior Center 420 E. Main St. Collinsville, Illinois. Township meetings are open to the public and everyone is welcome.

CUSD 10 Schools Earn State Recognition

Each year the Illinois State Board of Education releases report cards for public schools across the state. One component of the School Report Card is the summative designation — a descriptor of how well a school is meeting the needs of all students.

This designation is based on academics, student success, school culture and climate, financial investments, overall data, and data for individual student groups.

For 2023, Webster Elementary School was designated as an Exemplary school. This indicates that the school's overall performance is in the top 10 percent of all schools and has no underperforming student demographic groups.

Collinsville High School, Dorris Intermediate School, Caseyville Elementary, Kreitner Elementary, Maryville Elementary, Renfro



Elementary and Twin Echo Elementary were designated as Commendable schools. This indicates they have no underperforming student demographic groups. (Summit and Jefferson Elementaries are too small to receive a designation.)

CUSD 10 schools' Exemplary and Commendable status reflects investments the district has made in instructional staff, social emotional supports, STEM, early intervention programs and Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) to better meet the academic and social emotional needs of our students. *Go Kahoks!*

CMS, Kreitner & Webster to install solar arrays



The Collinsville School District Unit 10 has partnered with Renewable Energy Evolutions to construct and install three solar arrays that will be located at CMS, Kreitner and Webster.

The district expects the arrays to be operational in December of 2023. Preliminary estimates show the solar arrays will reduce electrical expenses approximately \$100,000 annually in the first full calendar year.

FIRE DEPARTMENT - LOANER RESIDENTIAL LOCKBOX PROGRAM

The Collinsville Fire Department, in conjunction with Collinsville's Faith in Action and the Age Smart coalition, are pleased to introduce a new program for our senior residents. The program is a loaner lockbox for our seniors or those physically challenged within our community. This program has been designed to enhance the age-in-place movement. Many times, our seniors need our assistance and cannot get to the door to let us in; with this new program, your paramedics will be able to get in without having to break glass or a door.

The program is designed for Collinsville and Collinsville FPD residents; typically seniors aged 65 and older living alone or with another senior,



both of whom may be experiencing a physical challenge that may cause limited mobility, have health conditions, and may not be able to get to the door. The Fire Department and/or Faith in Action will evaluate each application to ensure the applicant meets the intent of the program.

The boxes are similar to a realtor box placed on the outside front door handle and are designed to withstand tampering and harsh weather conditions. A house key and health information form will be secured in the box. The Fire Department will program the boxes with a code that will be kept secure. This will ensure that in an emergency, the responding crews will have access to the unique code, allowing immediate assistance. This quick access could potentially save lives.

The Collinsville Fire Department is administering this program. Age Smart coalition is providing these lockboxes through grants received, allowing this program to be free of charge. This is a loaner program, so when a resident no longer needs the box, it is returned to the Fire Department to be reissued to someone in need.

To see if you or a family member qualify for one of these limited residential loaner lockboxes, we will come to your home to verify the resident's situation fits into this plan. Contact the Fire Chief's Executive Assistant at 618-346-5022, x3141 or contact Faith in Action at 618-344-8080.



FALL SAFETY TIPS

With the seasons changing and temperatures dropping, we thought it would be a good time to provide some fire safety tips.

FIREPLACE SAFETY

For wood burning fireplaces the following should be inspected prior to use:

- The damper should be inspected to make sure it opens and closes properly. Also, the damper should be in the fully open position before starting a fire. Failure to fully open the damper could result in the release of toxic gases into your home.
- The flue should be checked prior to use and professionally cleaned to remove any excess buildup of creosote.
- Chimney caps are recommended to prevent birds and other animals from building nests in the chimney.
- Wire mesh screening should be used to prevent embers from flying out of the fireplace. These embers can not only damage floor finishes, but they can also start a fire.
- Only use fireplace tools when adjusting logs, and never move the logs with your hand. Fireplace gloves work well to prevent burns when adjusting hot doors or screens.

- The firebox should be periodically cleaned of ash during the burn season. The ash should be put in a metal container and allowed to cool completely before discarding. Remember, coals will stay hot long after a fire, so it is imperative they are disposed of properly.
- Ensure that fire starters, kindling, and logs are stored away from the fireplace so there is no way an ember can ignite them.

Follow the listed tips for a safe and warm burning season.



SMOKE DETECTORS



The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reports between 2012-2016, almost three out of five home fire deaths in the U.S. resulted from fires in homes with no smoke detectors or smoke detectors that were not working. Additionally, in 2019 there were 91 residential fire deaths in Illinois, with most of the deaths occurring in homes without working smoke detectors.

Time is everything when it comes to escaping a fire in your home, and working smoke detectors will increase your chances of escaping if a fire were to occur.

- It is recommended that smoke detectors be tested once a month, but the time change serves as a reminder to inspect, test, and replace any expired or non-working smoke detectors.
 Smoke detectors should be discarded once they are ten years old.
- It is also recommended that smoke detector batteries be replaced when the time changes in the spring and fall.
- Beginning January 1, 2023, a new Illinois law now requires tenyear sealed smoke detectors for all homes without hard-wired detectors.

CANDLES

Candles are one of the leading causes of residential fires. Please follow the tips listed below when using candles:

- · Never leave lit candles unattended.
- Never place lit candle next to flammable materials such as drapes, furniture, etc.
- Make sure lit candles are out of reach of children and pets.





CODE RED EMERGENCY

NOTIFICATION

Have you heard about the CodeRed notification available to all residents? CodeRed is an emergency notification system that enables your public safety personnel to notify residents and businesses by telephone, text message, email, social media and more of time-sensitive information, emergencies, or urgent alerts. Weather alerts are an option to keep you informed of severe weather threats. We encourage anyone living or working in Collinsville to register. Register the whole family!

Messages regarding the safety of our residents and community will be disseminated using CodeRED as one form of communication. We will send out alerts via phone, text, email, and social media in a variety of situations including boil water notices, gas leaks, evacuation notices, police activity, fire emergencies, missing persons and more. When you register to receive alerts, you will have the ability to select the types of alerts you wish to receive and your preferred methods to receive the messages.

The CodeRED system will leave a message on your answering machine or voicemail if you miss the phone call. If you do not have an answering machine, the system will consider the call as "incomplete" and will attempt to call again after several minutes have passed. If your phone line is busy, CodeRED will try two more times to connect. At any point, you may re-dial the 800 number on your caller ID to hear a replay of the message sent. Messages will have the caller ID # 866-419-5000 for emergencies and caller ID # 855-969-4636 for non-emergencies.

Please note that we recommend you register at least one phone number and one email address to ensure that you will receive alerts in the event of a power outage or an incident that may occur late at night when you are generally asleep. If you do not have a computer or have difficulty entering your information, contact the Fire Chief's Executive Assistant at 618-346-5022, x3141. Monday – Friday 08:30AM – 2:00PM and we will register for you. While you do not need to have anything on your phone to receive the messages, there is an App available, which is useful when traveling as it will send you alerts in the area where you are.

Addressing Homelessness in the City



Homelessness within the City of Collinsville has been on the hearts and minds of our residents, business owners, elected officials, and City staff. This is evidenced by the numerous conversations taking place on social media as well as reports to the Police Department and City Hall. Homelessness within the City is not new, nor is it against the law; however, recent gatherings of homeless individuals in our Uptown area have resulted in an increased public awareness and requests for action. The City hears you and understands your concerns regarding safety, appearance, sanitation, welfare, and more.

First and foremost, please be assured that our Police Department will always investigate and address criminal behavioral issues. If a criminal violation can be established, which includes behavior that breaches the peace, our Police Department will take the necessary action to remedy it. But we must also be clear - simply being homeless or unsheltered is not a crime and we cannot treat it as such. Understanding both the law and the causes for homelessness is key to establishing reasonable expectations and solutions.

The State of Illinois is one of three states to pass a "Homeless Bill of Rights" and the challenges we are facing today are no different

than those of our neighboring communities. Illinois law guarantees everyone "the right to use and move freely in public spaces, including but not limited to public sidewalks, public parks, public transportation, and public buildings, in the same manner as any other person and without discrimination on the basis of his or her housing status."



Homelessness can arise from various factors such as mental health, substance abuse, affordable housing shortages, family crises, and more. It may be surprising to learn that, despite being offered opportunities for housing and employment, some homeless individuals are homeless by choice — being homeless is simply their preference.

Initiated by local business owners, the City created a homeless stakeholder group in

the winter of 2022. The stakeholder group is made up of non-profits, local churches, local businesses and governmental entities and continues to meet regularly to collaborate on reducing homelessness in Collinsville through outreach and providing connections to resources. The City is also actively involved in the Madison County Continuum of Care monthly meetings, which are aimed at ending homelessness in Madison County. We continue to communicate with the homeless individuals and offer them the resources that are available, encompassing emergency/ welfare checks, transportation, shelter access, meal providers, health services, domestic violence assistance, employment training, and legal services.
